Art + Environmental Education Day Camp Registration Form Summer 2024

Welcome to Summer Day Camp!

The Art and Environmental Education Summer Day Camp is a place-based outdoor education program for students currently enrolled in TK - 6th grade of the 2023-2024 school year at all District elementary schools or Sierra Foothill Charter School. This program is a collaboration between the Mariposa County Arts Council (MCAC), Sierra Foothill Conservancy (SFC), and the Mariposa County Unified School District (MCUSD) Expanded Learning Opportunity Program. Summer camp consists of six weeks of outdoor activities led by naturalists, scientists, Indigenous culture keepers, and teaching artists who will assist students in safely exploring and celebrating local conserved natural landscapes.

Registration Process

Applications will be accepted from April 23rd - May 3rd. To register, fill out this form and return to your local school site, the MCUSD Office, or email to nancy@sierrafoothill.org. Forms are available online at www.mariposaartscouncil.org/summer-art-camp, at your child's school site or at the MCUSD Office. Participants will be notified electronically that they have secured a space in the program one week following the registration cutoff date. We hope to accept all interested students but need to be able to ensure adequate staffing as safety and the capacity to engage meaningfully with students are our top priorities. Students who are classified as Title 1 students will receive first priority for enrollment in this program. Once registration concludes, participants will receive a Family Handbook as well as other communications. Be sure to save the date for the Summer Camp Family Orientation Event on May 28th.

Summer Camp Location

Camp will take place at Mariposa Elementary School (MES) located at 5044 Jones St, Mariposa, CA 95338 and will include walking excursions to the nearby Mariposa Creek Parkway (4999 CA-140, Mariposa, CA 95338). Weekly field trips to SFC's Stookey Preserve (near Lushmeadows) and Yosemite Valley are included in camp programming.

Arrival and Departure Procedures

Drop off is located at the MES side entrance on 6th St. near the multipurpose room from 7:45 - 8:15 am. All students must be signed in with the camp coordinator when they are dropped off. If students arrive late, we cannot guarantee that they will be able to join their grade group as their group may have left the campus. Students must be picked up from the school no later than 5:00 pm each day of camp. Students may only be picked up by an authorized adult specified during registration. Staff may request photo identification of individuals collecting students. All students must be signed out when they are collected from the school. If you wish to pick your child up early, you will need to make formal arrangements with the Program Coordinator at least 24 hours in advance. Early release will not be allowed on Fridays as students will be in Yosemite.

Additional Program Details

Youth Code of Conduct

In order to maintain a safe and inspiring learning environment at Summer Camp, it is important that students treat staff and each other with respect and kindness. Camp rules and expected behavior are explained to the children on the first day of camp. Any behavior or inappropriate language which causes the learning atmosphere to deteriorate or be disrupted or which infringes upon the rights of others in the school may subject the student to corrective measures.

Natural Science and Cultural Heritage Programming

Day Camp is designed to provide a safe environment for students to explore and celebrate the natural landscapes in their community. Part of the camp's programming includes time spent interacting with the outdoors on the Mariposa Creek Parkway or during weekly field trips to SFC's Stookey Preserve near Lushmeadows and Wahhoga Village in Yosemite National Park. Each of these outdoor locations offer unique, hands-on learning experiences that connect students to local landscapes through scientific, cultural, and artistic lenses.

These special places hold cultural and ecological significance for the Southern Sierra Miwuk Nation who in partnership with SFC and MCAC are leading ongoing restoration efforts at each of these sites. These restoration efforts guide the program's curriculum. Mariposa Creek, for instance, is undergoing a restoration process focused on removing invasive species and restoring native plants. Students will learn about restoration by engaging in hands-on activities including watershed modeling, creating and using watercolor paint made with natural materials, nurturing newly planted native plants, and conducting scientific analysis of Mariposa Creek's health.

Similarly, SFC's Stookey Preserve near Lushmeadows boasts diverse ecosystems and serves as a habitat for various rare species of plants and animals. Through a visual and performing arts curriculum, students delve into the preserve's unique fauna, water cycles, and cultural preservation, promoting collaborative and connective learning.

Wahhoga Village in Yosemite National Park offers students a glimpse into Indigenous culture and heritage. Immersed in traditional arts like rattle making and weaving, students gain appreciation for the historic and contemporary significance of the Miwuk in Yosemite, expanding their horizons and fostering connections to local Tribal communities.

At its core, the Art + Environmental Day Camp program endeavors to provide meaningful, active, and collaborative learning experiences, nurturing students' deep connections to their community, local ecological and cultural landscapes, and instilling stewardship values for the future. We are here to help make this a smooth and enjoyable experience for participants and their families.
