

# **Submission Guidelines**

In Frame 2026 Youth Art Show

## **Eligibility**

- Must be between the ages of 11 and 18
- Must attend K-12 public, private, charter or home schools in Mariposa County
- Only submissions that follow all submission guidelines will be considered.
- Submissions should celebrate creativity and respect diversity. Artwork that promotes hate, violence, or bigotry, or includes inappropriate content, will not be accepted.

### **Artwork Specifications**

- One entry per student
- Artwork must be created within the past year, and related to this year's theme:
   All Things Pass
- Artwork must be original but may borrow images. For example, a collage made of magazine photos
- Artwork must be on a flat 8.5 x 11 surface
- A broad variety of media is encouraged including youth painting, drawing, printmaking, photography, digital media, mixed media, collage, 2D fiber arts, etc.

#### **Size and Dimensions**

- The pieces must be:
  - o 2-Dimensional
  - o One-sided
  - 8.5 x 11 inches

#### **How to Submit**

To submit your art, prepare these 5 items, and then upload them via the google form released on the Arts Council website during submission window (Dec. 15 - Jan. 9)

- 1. High resolution image of your artwork
- 2. Title of artwork
- 3. Medium type
- 4. Artwork Authorization Form
- 5. Your artist statement (50 100 words)

## How to take a photo of your art

To submit your art, you must email us a high resolution image. Here are our suggestions:

- Use natural or soft indoor lighting. Make sure there is no glare or shadows
  across your work. Lean your piece against a plain wall or lay it on the floor. The
  photo should include the entire piece, straight-on, with either a border of your
  backdrop or cropped around your work. Make sure that your image is clear and
  not blurry.
- A helpful video on Youtube is "<u>Hower's Art Class: Taking Photos of Your</u> Artwork"
- Ideal size: photo should be at least 1500 pixels on its longest side.
- Pixels can be checked on your phone by using the "Information" or "Details" panel while you're viewing your image.
